BEDLINGTON TERRIER JUDGING LIST QUALIFICATIONS 2010

Honesty and Integrity are a prime consideration for inclusion on any list.

A1 List

1. For persons have previously been approved by The Kennel Club to award CC's in the breed and have completed their first appointment. To have the support of The Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. Agreement to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press is also part of a judging contract.

A2 List

1. For persons who fulfil all the requirements for the A3 list and who have been assessed in accordance with KC requirements and accepted by the KC for inclusion on an A2 list and have the support The Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. Agreement to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press is also part of a judging contract.

A3 List (Breed Specialist).

1. To have a minimum of 7 years experience judging the breed and have the support The Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. To have judged at 1 Breed Club show.
3. To have judged the breed at 6 open shows or championship shows without CC's.
4. To have judged a minimum of 30 classes of the breed.
5. To have judged a minimum of 60 dogs.
6. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs when they obtained their 1st entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).
7. To have stewarded at 12 shows.
8. To have been actively involved in breeding/exhibiting the breed for a minimum of 10 years.
9. To have attended at least 1 breed specific seminar run in accordance with the relevant KC code of best practise and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable.
10. To have attended a seminar given by a KC accredited trainer on conformation and movement.
11. To have attended a Conformation and Movement "Hands=on Assessment" conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the assessment.
12. To have attended a seminar given by a KC accredited trainer and passed the relevant examination on KC regulations and judging procedures.
13. Agreement to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press is also part of a judging contract.

A3 List (Non-Specialist)

1. To have a minimum of 7 years experience judging in any breed (to include 5 years judging Bedlington Terriers) and have the support of The Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. To have judged at 1 Breed Club show.
3. To have judged the breed at 6 open shows or championship shows without CC's.
4. To have judged a minimum of 40 classes in this breed.
5. To have judged a minimum of 80 dogs in this breed.
6. To have awarded CC's in at least one other breed.
7. To have attended at least 1 breed specific judging seminar run in accordance with the relevant KC code of best practice and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable.
8. To have stewarded at 12 shows.
9. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs of any breed when they obtained their 1st entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).
10. Agreement to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press is also part of a judging contract.

B List (Breed Specialist)

1. To have 5 years experience owning and exhibiting in this breed and have the support The Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. To have judged 12 classes of this breed at open shows or championship shows without CC's.
3. To have judged 24 dogs of this breed.
4. To have attended at least 1 Breed Judging Seminar and passed an examination and/or assessment where applicable.
5. Agreement to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press is also part of a judging contract.

B List (Non-Specialist)

1. To have a minimum of 7 years experience in any one breed, 5 years in this breed and have the support of The Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. To have judged 16 classes of this breed at open shows or championship shows without CC's.
3. To have judged 32 dogs of this breed.
4. Agreement to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press is also part of a judging contract.

C List (Breed Specialist Or Non Breed Specialist)

For aspirant judges who have shown an interest in the breed and have the support of the club. Listings would normally include persons who have judged the breed at limited and open shows but do not yet qualify for the B List.
