JUDGING LIST CRITERIA as of 29th May 2017

The committee can exercise their discretion with regard to applications received in accordance with the previous criteria.

A1 List

1. For persons that have previously been approved by The Kennel Club to award CC's in the breed and have completed their first appointment and have the support of The Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. Agreement to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press.

A2 List

1. For persons who fulfil all the requirements for the A3 list and who have been assessed in accordance with KC requirements and accepted by the KC for inclusion on an A2 list and have the support The Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. Agreement to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press.

A3 List

Breed Specialist

1. To have a minimum of 7 years judging experience in the breed and have the support of the Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. To have judged at 1 Breed Club show.
3. To have judged the breed at 6 open shows or championship shows without CC's.
4. To have judged a minimum of 60 dogs in the breed which may include 20 dogs at seminars.
5. To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs when they obtained their 1st entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).
6. To have stewarded at 12 shows.
7. To have passed a formal assessment run in accordance with the KC code of best practise.
8. Attend a Seminar on the Requirements of a Dog Show Judge focusing on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures and pass an exam delivered by an approved Kennel Club Accredited Trainer for Regulations and Judging Procedures
9. Attend and pass the Points of a Dog assessment conducted by a specially trained Conformation and Movement Accredited Trainer.
10. Attend a seminar on Conformation and Movement delivered by an approved Kennel Club Accredited Trainer for Conformation and Movement.
11. Agree to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press.

Non-Specialist

1. To have a minimum of 7 years judging experience in any breed (to include 5 years judging Bedlington Terriers) and have the support of The Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. To have judged at 1 Breed Club show.
3. To have judged the breed at 6 open shows or championship shows without CC's.
4. To have judged a minimum of 60 dogs in this breed, which may include 20 dogs at seminar.
5. To have awarded CC's in at least one other breed.
6. To have attended one breed specific seminar and passed the multiple choice examination on the breed standard. Plus have approval from two different mentors.
7. To have passed a formal assessment on this breed run in accordance with the KC code of best practise.

8. Attend a Seminar on the Requirements of a Dog Show Judge focusing on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures and pass an exam delivered by an approved Kennel Club Accredited Trainer for Regulations and Judging Procedures
9. Attend and pass the Points of a Dog assessment conducted by a specially trained Conformation and Movement Accredited Trainer.
10. Attend a seminar on Conformation and Movement delivered by an approved Kennel Club Accredited Trainer for Conformation and Movement.
11. Agree to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press.

B List

Breed Specialist

1. To have a minimum of 5 years experience owning and exhibiting this breed and have the support of the Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. To have judged a minimum of 6 shows and 15 dogs at these shows with an adequate geographical spread.
3. To have attended TWO breed specific seminars and passed the multiple choice examination on the breed standard. Plus have approval from two different mentors.
4. Attend a Seminar on the Requirements of a Dog Show Judge focusing on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures and pass an exam delivered by an approved Kennel Club Accredited Trainer for Regulations and Judging Procedures
5. Attend and pass the Points of a Dog assessment conducted by a specially trained Conformation and Movement Accredited Trainer.
6. Attend a seminar on Conformation and Movement delivered by an approved Kennel Club Accredited Trainer for Conformation and Movement.
7. Agree to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press.

Non-specialist

1. To have a minimum of 7 years judging experience in any one breed, 5 years in this breed and have the support of the Midland Bedlington Terrier Club.
2. To have judged a minimum of 24 dogs of this breed with a minimum average of 3 per class.
3. To have attended one breed specific seminar and have received approval from their mentor.
4. Attend a Seminar on the Requirements of a Dog Show Judge focusing on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures and pass an exam delivered by an approved Kennel Club Accredited Trainer for Regulations and Judging Procedures
5. Attend and pass the Points of a Dog assessment conducted by a specially trained Conformation and Movement Accredited Trainer.
6. Attend a seminar on Conformation and Movement delivered by an approved Kennel Club Accredited Trainer for Conformation and Movement.
7. Agree to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press.

C List

1. (Breed specialists only) To be active in the breed for a minimum of 5 years
2. For aspirant judges who have shown an interest in the breed and have the support of the club.
3. Attend a Seminar on the Requirements of a Dog Show Judge focusing on Kennel Club Regulations and Judging Procedures and pass an exam delivered by an approved Kennel Club Accredited Trainer for Regulations and Judging Procedures
4. Attend and pass the Points of a Dog assessment conducted by a specially trained Conformation and Movement Accredited Trainer.
5. Attend a seminar on Conformation and Movement delivered by an approved Kennel Club Accredited Trainer for Conformation and Movement.
6. Agree to write a critique and submit for publication in the canine press.
